#### The CSA Annual Conference Update

The 2014 CSA Annual Conference will take place from the 24<sup>th</sup> – 26<sup>th</sup> October in Antigua. Friday will be reserved for the Annual General Meeting with the afternoon session primarily focused on youth development. Tim Cross of ISAF with responsibility for Youth Development in Group O nations will be attending and will begin the sessions with an outline of his role and how he can help MNAs and associations with their youth development program and projects. The meeting will then hear from Elizabeth Jordan, President of Antigua's National Sailing Academy, about the creation of the Academy and the challenges, opportunities and ongoing strategy for sustaining and developing it.

Saturday and Sunday will consist of sessions running concurrently for regatta organizers, youth development representatives and measurers, as well as some shared sessions. The agenda will be published well ahead of time so you can arrange to attend the meetings most relevant to you and plan your visit accordingly.

# **CSA Minimum Safety Requirements**

We would like to remind you that the CSA has made the decision to no longer provide minimum safety requirements for regattas in the Caribbean. The CSA Board recognized at the 2013 Annual General Meeting that this important function is being addressed by several other sailing organizations at a much greater level-and it was therefore voted to no longer provide minimum requirements. Regatta organisers please take note when preparing your Notices of Race for future events.
