Island Water World Grenada Sailing Week 28 Jan – 2 Feb 2016 - Spice it up in Grenada!

This upbeat, growing regatta is fast becoming established on the Caribbean racing calendar. Small enough to retain a warm and friendly welcome, but large enough to provide challenging competition, the racing fleet is a mixture of local and international yachts. It is organized by sailors for sailors, with a variety of race courses and host venues, introducing participants to Grenada's excellent sailing waters, marine services and talented entertainers.

Growing Number of Participants

The first edition of this sailing week in 2013 drew 29 entries. In 2014 the event drew 36 entries from 13 countries. In 2015 there were 39 boats registered from 12 countries. There are already 30 boats signed up for the 2016 regatta, so given previous trends, there should be over 40 participants, resulting in 350 - 450 captains/crew/supporters/officials coming to Grenada.

Classes Competing

For the 2016 event there is a range of options for a variety of boat designs and racing levels: **Racing Class** - for the seriously competitive, spinnaker flying, hi tech boats

Racer Cruiser 1 & 2 – these classes have the option of flying spinnakers with relevant handicap rating **Cruising Class** – no spinnakers, as this is a more relaxed, fun class

Classic Class – longer courses have been specially tailored for these graceful traditional yachts **J24 Class** – this is a one design class with crews on identical boats doing battle over multiple short races **Charter Class** – if there are sufficient entries, this will also be an option, otherwise these boats will slot into the Racer/Cruiser or Cruising Classes

On Monday the yachts move down to the third host venue, **Prickly Bay Marina**, for exciting courses off the challenging South Coast and a grand finale to the week's racing.
