

PCYC ROUND GRENADA RACE
Notice of Race
August 31 - 1 September 2019

1. ORGANIZATION

1.1 The Round Grenada Regatta is organized by the Petite Calivigny Yacht Club (PCYC). Race Headquarters will be at Le Phare Bleu Marina 30-31 August to 1 September for the Skippers Briefing and the start of race 1 and the finish for race 2.

2. RULES

The races will be governed by the rules as defined by the ISAF Racing Rules of Sailing 2017 to 2020.

2.1.1

No protests allowed. Avoid collisions at all times.

2.1.2

The course to be sailed is to the written word.

2.2

Race 1 will start at Le Phare Bleu, head out through the channel to the outer yellow mark. Unless otherwise specified, take the mark to stb. if going up the West coast or to port if going up the East coast.

Race 2 will start at the Carriacou finish line for race 1 and proceed down the opposite coast utilized in race 1 to the outer yellow mark at Le Phare Bleu. Take the mark on the same side as used for the start and proceed to the finish line at Le Phare Bleu.

2.3 SAILS

Spinnakers optional

2.4 ENGINES

Engines shall be turned off before the 5 minute race warning signal. If you have to use your engine during the race, please let the committee know. Using the engine will disqualify you from the race.

3. CLASSES

There are two classes, J24's and Open class

3.1 Skippers Briefing

will be at 18h00 on Friday 30 August, at The Lightship, Le Phare Bleu Marina.

3.2 Schedule of Races and First signal

Time check 06h30 local time

Race 1:

Saturday 31 August, first warning not before 06:55 am. Open Class start at 07:00, J-24 Class start at 07:05. Any boat finishing after 16:00 will be given a finish time of 16:00.

Race 2:

Sunday 1 September, first warning not before 09:25. Open Class start at 09:30, J-24 Class start at 09:35. Any boat finishing after 16:00 will be given a finish time of 16:00

4. SAFETY

Boats taking part in the race are recommended to refer to ISAF safety regulations.

4.1 For all classes anchors are permitted to stay on bow rollers and stern rollers while racing.

4.2 Boats must have suitable charts on board for the sailing area.

5. ENTRIES

5.1 Fees: Early registration \$100 EC per boat after the 24 August the fee is \$150 EC per boat.

5.2 All boats must report for Final Registration on 30 August 2019, between 15h00 & 17h30

6. SCORING

This is a non-handicap race. The first three boats across the line will be placed.

7. COMMUNICATION

Every entry must have a working VHF on board. The race committee will be operating on channel 11 for all classes. Any boat retiring shall notify the race committee by VHF if possible. When finishing, notifying the race committee of the boats name is suggested. Any boat unable to finish prior to 16:00 shall notify the race committee of position and ETA.

8. PRIZES

There will be a daily prize-giving after each day's racing for the first boat crossing the finish line. At the final prize-giving on the last day of racing, prizes to the first three boats and a prize to the Overall Winner of the regatta will also be presented.

9. COMMITTEE DESK

A Committee desk will be located at Le Phare Bleu Marina from Friday 30 August to 1 September.
